











The CCWD LHMP is a customized single-jurisdictional plan tailored to geographically cover people, property, and critical water & wastewater assets within CCWD's service area that is within the Calaveras County jurisdictional boundary.







This included analyzing each section using FEMA's 2023 Local Mitigation Planning Handbook and the 2022 Local Mitigation Planning Policy Guide (Effective April 19, 2023) to ensure that the plan met the latest requirements.







## Hazard Mitigation Goals











- Protect water supply, transmission, and storage facilities and reduce exposure to hazard-related property and water assets losses from wildfire, extreme heat, flooding, and the effects of climate change.
- Increase resiliency of water supply to drought and climate change effects.
- Focus on watershed health improvements to reduce vulnerability and risk to critical infrastructure from natural hazards.
- Improve collaboration between partner water agencies, first responders, emergency management planners, and the public to maintain water system reliability.
- Increase water system redundancy and improve service levels.



To meet identified goals and objectives, the plan recommends 38 mitigation actions. Which includes 19 mitigation actions that were carried over from the 2018 LHMP and 18 new mitigation actions.



## Wildfire Risk

Wildfire risk is highest across a broad section of the central and eastern sections of the CCWD's Planning Area. Calaveras County has a higher risk of wildfire than **98%** of counties in the US and **76%** of counties in California. Cal FIRE designated 35 communities in the County as "Communities at Risk" within the National Fire Plan.

25 critical facilities in "High" Wildfire Threat Zone


